For this reason, we have recently sent all of you an update on the continuation of AmCham's activities. In addition, we have attached a small handbook as a reference guide for those of you who have the need to deal with the United States. This should be seen as our starting point for monitoring this situation and for providing a regular flow of information for a better understanding of how to deal with problems connected to COVID-19.

In the next few days AmCham will be sending you the results of a survey we conducted analyzing how major American and Italian multinationals have already been reacting to COVID-19. It focuses on which specific measures have been put in place to ensure business continuity, despite this time of uncertainty.

AmCham has the expectation that we will be able to emerge from this crisis even stronger and more cohesive than before. We have a firm belief in the strength of our people, our institutions and our business community to overcome these challenges.

### **GOVERNMENT MEASURES**

On March 8th and 9th 2020, the government issued two decrees of the Prime Minister's Office ([here](#) you can consult that of 8 March and [here](#) that of 9 March) for the containment and contrast of the spread of COVID-19 on the entire national territory. The provisions of the decree are effective until April 3rd, 2020, and have the aim of limiting the spread of the virus and preventing the overload of national health facilities.

On the 11th of March 2020 the Government, having deemed it necessary to adopt even more compelling measures to contain and manage the epidemiological emergency, issued a decree by the Prime Minister which **provides for the complete closure of commercial activities throughout Italy until the 25th of March 2020, with the exception of activities related to the sale of basic necessities**. ### **THE GLOBAL CONTEXT**

### **THE SITUATION IN THE UNITED STATES**

For more details on the situation in the US, we recommend this [CDC webpage](#). Major scientific publications have devoted specific focus to COVID-19. [Nature](#) has created a webpage with as much information as possible, while the renowned medical journal [The Lancet](#) has constant updates on COVID-19 and, in an [editorial on March 7th](#), it examined the timing and measures to take prevent the virus from becoming a pandemic.

### **THE RACE TO A VACCINE**

Unfortunately, as is widely known, we do not currently have a vaccine for COVID-19.

The WHO has created a [webpage](#) with explanations and clarifications that should clear up any “myths”.

**Moderna Therapeutics** in the US and **Galilee Research Institute** in Israel are working as quickly as possible on the development of a vaccine and the signs are encouraging.

### **GLOBAL ECONOMIC OUTLOOK**

The first analyses and studies of the impact of coronavirus are only now beginning to be published to meet the needs of the world economy.

The [International Monetary Fund](#) has set aside USD 50 billion for this global emergency, and Italy will be a beneficiary. The IMF has also published a series of articles on coronavirus. We [direct you](#) to one written by Managing Director Kristalina Georgieva.

The experts at the American *think tank* [RAND Corporation](#) have published Q&As on the virus.

And the [Atlantic Council](#) think tank has a coronavirus webpage with specific analyses of its impact on the global economy and geopolitics.

The OECD has published an [initial analysis](#) of the global impact of coronavirus, noting that it will certainly have repercussions on the growth trajectories of all major world economies and highlighting a few key takeaways. Follow [this link](#) to the full report.

### **WHAT THE U.S. HAS TO SAY**

The Trump Administration is carefully monitoring developments in the situation around the world.

In the event of an outbreak in the US, [Congress has approved a USD 8.3 billion spending package to prevent and contain coronavirus](#).

The U.S. Chamber of Commerce held a [press conference on March 4th](#) to discuss coronavirus, publishing [an initial study](#) of the impact and a [message](#) urging the business community not to overreact.

### **THE ECONOMIC IMPACT IN ITALY**

### **THE AIR TRAFFIC SITUATION IN ITALY AND TO/FROM THE UNITED STATES**

As of March 9th, Alitalia has rescheduled flights to/from Milan Linate, Malpensa and Venice. Specifically, the airline has suspended flights to/from Malpensa until 3 April 2020, focusing on - and significantly reducing - domestic flights to/from Linate and Venice (the only connections to/from Venice are with Rome).

In accordance with the Directive of the Italian Ministry of Internal Affairs for the implementation of checks in the areas subject to the strictest containment measures, **departing passengers will be checked** and required to show both their tickets and a written statement that the travel is necessary. Similar checks will be conducted on arriving passengers. Passengers in transit will not undergo these checks. ENAC reminds passengers to contact their airline for updates on the status of their flight considering the cuts in recent days.

Regarding travel to the US, [President Trump announced the suspension of flights from Europe for 30 days](#), starting from Friday 13th of March at midnight, as a measure to counter the spread of Coronavirus on national territory.

## **RULES OF HYGIENE**

- **Wash your hands frequently.** Keep alcohol-based solutions available in all public places, gyms, supermarkets, drug stores and other crowded places, so people may disinfect their hands
- **Stay away** from anyone with an acute respiratory infection
- **Avoid hugging and shaking hands**
- When socializing, keep a personal **distance of at least one meter**
- **Sneeze or cough into a tissue**, keeping your hands clean
- **Do not share bottles or glasses**, especially when playing sports
- **Do not touch your eyes**, nose or mouth
- **Cover your nose and mouth** when you sneeze or cough
- **Do not take anti-viral drugs or antibiotics** without a doctor's prescription
- **Clean surfaces** with chlorine- or alcohol-based disinfectants
- Only wear a **mask if you think you might be sick** or if you are **caring for sick people**
